BALD CYPRESS




Bald Cypress—Taxodium distichum

Deciduous, long living conifer with soft, feathery light green needles in summer. Rust red fall color and cinnamon colored bark. Best known in wet areas but adapts to dry conditions as well. Tolerates a wide range of soil conditions ranging from somewhat dry soils to wet.

Mature Size: 55' x 30' - Fall Color: Rust

Lindsey Skyward—Taxodium distichum 'Skyward'

Attractive dwarf conifer forms a dense, narrow spire with soft, rich green foliage. Leaf green spring foliage matures to deep green in summer. Fine, feathery needles change to a copper hue in fall, holding their color for weeks before falling. Textured bronzy bark adds interest. Ideal accent for smaller gardens.






COTTONWOOD

Siouxland Cottonless—Populus deltoides

Seedless male cottonwood that quickly grows into a majestic shade tree with no fluffy mess. Shimmering foliage turns bright yellow in the fall. Extremely hardy and tolerates a wide range of soils. useful for creating a windbreak, stabilizing soil on a slope, or in areas where quick shade is needed. Best used for large scale plantings.





ELM



Allee Lacebark—Ulmus parvifolia

Glossy green foliage turns orange-yellow to rust-red in fall. Peeling bark exhibits vibrant shades of gray, green, brown and orange. A very tough tree that will tolerate many harsh conditions. It's also very water thrifty and resistant to Dutch elm disease. Low maintenance and fast-growing!

Mature Size: 60' x 45' - Fall Color: Yellow

Did you know... Elm trees had all but disappeared from our landscapes at one time due to Dutch Elm Disease. However, these newer varieties are resistant, so we can enjoy these beautiful, fast growing trees with year round interest once again. Many varieties were successfully tried and proven locally, at the John C. Pair Horticulture Center in Derby, Kansas.





Frontier Elm—Ulmus 'Frontier'

A quick growing, medium sized shade tree with an upright, pyramidal form. Small glossy green leaves in the spring, with lovely redpurple autumn coloration. Bark is a magnificent combination of gray, green orange and brown. Tolerates most soils. Superior resistance to Dutch Elm Disease and elm leaf beetles.

Mature Size: 35' x 25' - Fall Color: Burgundy

HONEY LOCUST

Skyline Thornless - Gleditsia triacanthos

Well suited for street tree planting since lower branches can be removed without disturbing the shape of the crown. Casts light shade, meaning lawns grow well beneath it. Requires little fall cleanup since the leaflets filter in between grass blades or wash away in the rain. Showy fall colors.



Mature Size: 45' x 35' - Fall Color: Yellow

Did you know... Honey locust trees have small blooms in late spring, filling the air with an incredible, sweet aroma. The fragrance is especially noticeable with a warm spring breeze.

LINDEN





Greenspire - Tilia cordata 'Greenspire'

With a strong central leader and attractive pyramidal form, this is a very reliable shade tree, even for difficult conditions. Very flexible wood makes them an excellent choice for open windy areas. Tiny, yellow, fragrant flowers appear in early summer and small, heart-shaped, green leaves turn a beautiful yellow in fall.

Mature Size: 40' x 30' - Fall Color: Yellow

MAPLE



Autumn Blaze Maple—Acer x freemannii

Brilliant, long lasting, orange red foliage in the fall. Dense, up right, shade tree. Grows four times faster than other red maple hybrids. Cross between a red maple and a silver maple that took the best traits from both. The harder wood of a red maple but fast growing like a silver maple.

Mature Size: 50' x 35' - Fall Color: Red

Burgundy Belle Maple—Acer rubrum

Excellent symmetrical branching habit and outstanding fall color. Dark green summer foliage turns to an outstanding, long lasting fall color of brilliant red then changes to an intense burgundy as it ages. Great for a parkway or shade tree.

Mature Size: 45' x 35' - Fall Color: Red

Crimson Sunset Maple

Acer truncatum x plantanoides 'JF \bar{S} -KW202'

Flourishing in climates with hot and humid weather, it's drought and heat tolerant leaves resist tatter and scorch damage and retain their rich, dark, glossy color all summer long. Round to oval habit. Fall color maroon to reddish bronze.

Mature Size: 35' x 25' - Fall Color: Red

Fall Fiesta Sugar Maple

Acer saccharum 'Balista

A vigorous growing tree with full, dense, symmetrical branching. Leathery, glossy, deep green foliage turns to shades of incredible red, orange and yellow in fall. Resistant to leaf tatter. One of the best Sugar Maple trees for both hot and cold climates. Likes well drained soil.

Mature Size: 50' x 50' - Fall Color: Orange



John Pair Sugar Maple—Acer saccharum

Symmetrical and rounded in form, this heat resistant caddo sugar maple is also resistant to disease. This tree was released by the John C. Pair Horticulture Center from Haysville, right here in Kansas. Perfect medium sized tree for landscapes limited on space. Likes well drained soil.

Mature Size: 30' x 20' - Fall Color: Red-Orange

Redpointe Maple - A. saccharum 'Bailsta'

Classy, medium-sized shade tree with a neat, clean, teardrop-shaped outline. Fast-growing, adaptable and unfussy native has no major pest issues and requires virtually no pruning to maintain its broad-pyramidal shape. Fall color is fiery red.

Mature Size: 45' x 35' - Fall Color: Brilliant Red





Compact, upright and narrow, develops a naturally uniform, dense canopy with minimal pruning. Easy to grow, drought tolerant and relatively problem free, it produces few seeds and develops an ideal, upright street tree form. Beautiful deep red fall color. Hard wood and fast grower.

Mature Size: 35' x 25' - Fall Color: Deep Red






OAK

Bur—Quercus macrocarpa

A mighty sight to behold. A coarsely textured crown, wild and wooly acorns and a massive trunk with rough and deeply furrowed bark combine to make one impressive tree. Native to the eastern two-thirds of Kansas. Moderate growth rate on a site with adequate moisture and fertile soil.







Chinkapin—Quercus muhlenbergii


Very stately shade tree with year-round interest. Longlasting deciduous tree with a very wide, open crown. Strong branches, interesting leaves and a scaly ridged central trunk, it's a conversation piece of a tree. Adapts well in various soil conditions. Yellow and orange fall colors.

Mature Size: 50' x 50' - Fall Color: Yellow

Crimson Spire

Quercus alba x Q.robur 'Crimschmidt'

Rich, dark green leaves stay fresh and bright through the heat of summer, turning rusty red to bright red in mid to late autumn. This fast growing, cold hardy, drought tolerant and disease resistant tree adapts to varied soils and tough urban growing conditions. Columnar.







Red—Quercus rubra

Huge shade tree that is long-lasting, incredibly hardy and fast growing. Thrives in nearly every condition imaginable. Foliage is handsome throughout the year, emerging pinkishred. turning lustrous dark, glossy green in summer, and changing to russet-red to bright red in autumn

Mature Size: 70' x 50' - Fall Color: Red

Swamp White—Quercus bicolor

Striking tree with attractive peeling bark. Leaves are dark green on top with a silverywhite underside. Fall color is an orange-gold to yellow in mid-autumn. Suited to wet locations, although drought tolerant.

SHADE TREES





White—Quercus alba

Extraordinary shade tree with year-round interest. Long lasting, spacious deciduous tree with a majestic, wide crown. Can be an outstanding pre-eminant shade tree for your yard. Branches grow in wide angles, forming an incredibly broad rounded crown. Dark red-brown foliage in the fall.

Mature Size: 60' x 60' - Fall Color: Wine

SYCAMORE

Exclamation London Plane Tree

Platanus x acerifolia 'Morton Circle'

Rapid growing shade tree with exfoliating bark. Develops large, open branches with maturity. Large, dark green leaves provide dense shade. Adapts well in various soil conditions.

Mature Size: 70' x 40' - Fall Color: Yellow

Emerald City—Liriodendron tulipfera

An upright, oval tree with deep green, glossy foliage. Fall color is bright yellow. Blooms greenish yellow with orange centers in mid spring. Very lovely up close. This variety is an improvement on the familiar Tulip Tree with a strong center leader and more compact form.

Heritage River Multi Stem—Betula nigra

A beautiful, multi-branched tree prized for its highly textural, colorful, peeling bark. An exceptional specimen tree. Provides striking winter interest. This versatile, highly heat tolerant tree thrives in settings with high water tables and problematic low wet soils. Dark green leaves yellow in the fall. **Full sun.**

Royal Frost Multi Stem

Betula "Royal Frost"

Quick growing tree attains an upright, pyramidal shape with white exfoliating bark strikingly contrasting its deep burgundy foliage that emerges in spring, remains a rich purple in summer and changes to deep red in fall. Most successful in moist, well-draining soils. Deer and borer resistant. Full sun or partial shade.

CHOKECHERRY

Canada Red Chokecherry—Prunus virginiana

A tough, hardy ornamental tree with year-round interest. Showy white flowers in the spring. Its early summer foliage of bright red-purple turns green and back to purple again in the later months. Beautiful in the winter time, and attracts birds with its tiny fruit. Attractive canopy, even in winter. **Full sun**.

CRABAPPLE

Royal Raindrops—*Malus x 'JFS-KW5' PP #14,375*

Great small ornamental tree with a rounded form at maturity. Eye-popping magenta pink blooms, deep purple cutleaf foliage, sparkling red fruits and bright fall color give all-season appeal to this easy-care flowering ornamental. Uniquely shaped leaves emerge glossy deep purple and maintain their rich color through the heat of summer. Full sun.

Sargentina—Malus sargentii 'Tina'

Great small ornamental tree with a rounded form at maturity. Pink buds open into **pure white flowers** in the spring. Small red fruits are a favorite of birds. Excellent tree for small yards. **Full sun.**

Bloodgood—Acer palmatum var. atropurpureum 'Bloodgood'



Attractive foliage with burgundy red coloring turns brilliant scarlet in fall. The interesting red-black bark provides striking interest in winter. This slender, airy tree is well-suited for use in patios and entryways. One of the hardiest of Japanese maples. **Partial sun to shade.** Requires protected area.

Mature Size: 20' x 15' - Fall Color: Red

Crimson Queen—Acer palmatum 'Crimson Queen'

A low-branching, dwarf tree with a delicate, weeping form. The foliage holds its beautiful crimson color throughout summer and can turn bright scarlet in autumn. Plant in a protected area away from direct sun. Works best on the north or east side of your house. **Partial sun to shade.**

LILAC

Dwarf Korean Tree Form

Syringa meyeri palibin

Dapper little lollipop-shaped tree. Dwarf Korean Lilac blooms a bit later than Common Lilacs and has wavy, nickel-sized leaves that are mildew resistant. Whether in or out of bloom, this tree has a neat outline and a clean, polished look that complements many garden styles. **Full sun.**

Ivory Silk Japanese Tree

Syringa reticulata

Small, deciduous tree with a smooth bark and oval crown. Panicles of **creamy white, fragrant blooms** late spring to early summer with rich green foliage. Great small specimen tree or background plant. **Full sun to light shade.**

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MAGNOLIA

Saucer—Magnolia x soulangiana

Broad shrub or small tree with handsome oval-shaped leaves. Fragrant flowers bloom up to 8" in diameter in early spring before the foliage emerges. The **pink-purple saucer-shaped blooms** smell like none other. **Full to part sun.**

MAPLE

Shantung—Acer truncatum

Evenly rounded head and dense branching structure, perfect for any small yard or great accent tree for larger yards. The foliage emerges a gorgeous reddish-purple in the spring, turns dark green in summer. Tolerates alkaline soils, heat and drought and is very resistant to pests and disease. Very water thrifty! **Full sun to part shade.**

NINEBARK

Summer Wine Tree Form

Physocarpus opulifolius 'Summerwine'

Gracefully arching foliage is purple all through the season with the white flowers covering the stems in late June. Attractive branches and white, exfoliating bark for winter interest. Tough and adaptable. Full sun or part shade.

Mature Size: 8' x 5-6' - Fall Color: Purple/Red



PEAR



Chanticleer—Pyrus Calleryana

A compact pyramidal ornamental tree with masses of white flowers in spring. Gorgeous glossy green foliage turns to deep red in the fall, has a smooth grey bark. Great for spaces where lateral space to spread is limited. Less susceptible to early freezes than other pears. **Full sun**.

Mature Size: 30 'x 15' - Fall Color: Red

REDBUD

Eastern—Cercis canadensis

Single stem and multi stem varieties available. Beautiful landscape tree valued for its timing; the rosy-pink flowers appear on bare branches bridging the gap between winter and spring. Showy yellow foliage in fall, heart-shaped glossy green in summer. Round headed deciduous tree. **Full sun or shade.**

Mature Size: 25' x 20' - Fall Color: Yellow



Cotton Candy—Cercis Canadensis 'John Sjo'

Single stem. Unique pale pink flowers, touched with lavender striations cover the bare branches. Once the flowers have gone, medium green foliage is held until fading to a yellow fall color. **Sun to part shade.**





SERVICEBERRY







Autumn Brilliance—Amelanchier x grandiflora



Stems will be covered in white blossoms each spring and sweet purplish-black fruit each fall. Its spectacular show of white flowers in early spring is one of its main ornamental features. They begin to flower as a pale pink then fade to snowy white fragrant flowers. The petite blue-green foliage turns a brilliant reddish-orange in the autumn. **Sun to part shade**.

Mature Size: 25' x 15' - Fall Color: Orange/Red

Did you know... It is better to plant your trees and shrubs slightly higher than ground level than below? Roots need oxygen just as much as they need water. See our Best Planting Practices guide on page 55 of this book, or pick up a copy at the Garden Store.

ARBORVITAE

Green Giant

Thuja standishii x plicata 'Green Giant'

A large, vigorous, fast growing evergreen. Natural pyramidal to conical form boasts dense, rich green foliage that darkens or bronzes only a little in the winter. This is an exceptional landscape tree for use as a screen, hedge, or single specimen. **Part sun.**



Mature Size: 30' x 15'



JUNIPER

Canaerti—Juniperus virginiana

An upright juniper equipped with extra personality. As it ages, it attains a unique profile as the branch tips extend like arms, waving and opening, to greet you. Dark green in color. An excellent, hardy choice for windbreaks and privacy screens. Abundance of berries makes this a good source of wildlife food. **Full sun.**



Mature Size: 20' x 6'

Spartan—Juniperus chinesis

A handsome, fast growing evergreen that forms a stately, dark green, densely branched column well-suited for use as a formal accent, screen or windbreak. In its natural form, the symmetrical, pyramidal shape rarely needs pruning. An excellent specimen for formal topiary. Tolerates heat, cold and drought. **Full sun.**

Taylor—Juniperus virginiana

Great for formal vertical accents or privacy hedging. It has dark green color in summer and a purple tone in winter. Perfect evergreen for a narrow space to create a screen in the landscape. This conifer needs **full sun** and well-drained soil. Softer and more dense than similar junipers.

PINES

Bosnian-Pinus leucodermis

Slow growing pine with strong central leader and tight, pyramidal form in youth. As it ages, this pine opens to show a nice layered branching habit. The needles are deep, dark green. Makes a fine landscape specimen, accent tree or windbreak. **Full sun.**

Mature Size: 40' x 15'

Vanderwolf Limber Pine *Pinus flexilis 'Vanderwolf's Pyramid*

Dense, broad pyramidal in youth; becoming a low, broad, flattopped tree at maturity. The pine needles are soft, silvery bluegreen and very attractive. Great as a specimen or wind break. Disease and insect resistant. **Full sun.**

Mature Size: 25' x 15'



SPRUCE

Baby Blue—Picea pungens gluca 'Baby Blue'



Grown from seed, not grafted. Very blue, conical spruce with needles arranged in a full round pattern. Typically strong, symmetrical growers. Does best in well drained soil with good air flow around them. Stately, excellent specimen trees. They are long lived, and can grow 10" to 15"+ per year. Full sun.

Mature Size: 35' x 15' Spruce cont. on pg. 13

Avoid planting spruce trees in shade or in wet spots. If planting in heavy soil, they will benefit if the ground is mounded or bermed to give them more drainage. The heavier, wetter the ground, the more essential it is to mound them.



Bakeri Blue—Picea pungens 'bakeri'

Semi-dwarf, grafted cultivar of the Colorado Blue Spruce. Silvery-blue needles are larger and have more consistent color than other blue spruce cultivars. Bakeri is a slow-grower that is ideal for an accent tree or where space is limited. It can tolerate a wide variety of soil conditions once established, but avoid wet sites and shaded areas. **Full sun.**


Picea pungens 'Baby Blueyes'

Semi-dwarf selection is useful for smaller landscapes and confined spaces. Dense, eye-catching silvery blue-green foliage holds its color well. Growing only a few inches per year, it develops a broad, pyramidal form. Smaller than its cousin Baby Blue spruce. **Full sun.**

Mature Size: 15' x 15'

Black Hills—Picea glauca densata

Desirable, symmetrical cone shape to this slow growing, evergreen conifer. Dense bright-green needles mature to an interesting blue-green. Great landscape accent, useful as windbreak or screening. Fantastic as a landscape accent, or in groupings as a windbreak or screen. **Full sun.**







Blue Totem Spruce

Picea pungens glauca [†]Blue Totem'

This incredibly narrow selection of Colorado Spruce has an exceptional bright-blue color. An excellent accent plant for any landscape. Powder blue/green needles, and branches that are tight to the body. Grows 4-6" annually. Narrow, upright, excellent choice for a small garden. **Full sun**.

Mature Size: 12' x 3'

Dwarf Alberta—Picea glauca 'conica'

A perfect cone shaped dwarf conifer. Very dense needle pattern and a classic pyramidal shape. Aromatic green needles are about ¾" long. Can be used as an artistically pruned topiary. Makes a formal statement in the garden. Superb container specimen. **Full sun.**







Fat Albert—Picea pungens 'Fat Albert'

A superb evergreen conifer with rich blue needles on a densely branched, naturally pyramidal form. An outstanding landscape specimen. A very slow grower that exhibits full, dense growth even in youth. Choice for specimen planting or for privacy screens. Grows larger over time. **Full sun.**

Globe Blue on Standard

Pinus pungens 'Glauca Globosa'

Dense evergreen dwarf tree, selected and trained to grow in a small tree-like form with the primary plant grafted high atop a standard. Its relatively fine texture and striking steel blue foliage sets it apart from other landscape plants. Highly ornamental and remains blue throughout the winter. Full sun.

Mature Size: 6' x 5'

Hoopsi-Picea pungens 'Hoopsii'

Outstanding evergreen tree, generally considered the bluest form. New growth is especially bright blue. Pyramidal form that holds stiff horizontal branches with dense silvery-blue needles. The vibrant blue-green color is remarkable for its intensity and richness. **Full sun.**

Mature Size: 30' x 20'



Norway Spruce—Picea abies

Fastest growing of the spruces, 1 to 3 feet per year. Develops strong graceful branches in a pyramidal form that are covered with dark green needles on dense branches. Ideal for tall screen, windbreak or a traditional show piece. Tolerates heat and humidity well. Full sun.

Picea glauca 'Skinny Blue Genes'



Althea—(Rose of Sharon)



Althea, commonly called Rose-of-Sharon, flowers in late summer, providing a flush of color late in the season when everything else is done blooming. Plant in to borders or as an informal specimen in beds. A wide range of cultivars allows you to choose an althea variety in the color and size that works best in your landscape design. Traditional Althea usually mature to a size of 8-10', while the Lil' Kim Althea series stay more compact at 3-4'. Both are great hummingbird attractors no matter the color and add amazing summer color to your landscape. We will have many varieties available. Call or see Garden Store for specifics. 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Azaleas

Deciduous azaleas grow in an upright habit and tend to be taller than evergreen azaleas, maturing in height from 8 to 15 feet tall. Flowers are tubular with long stamens that extend beyond their petals. Deciduous azaleas bloom bright, colorful white, purple, pink, red, orange or yellow flowers beginning in the spring. The foliage offers a colorful autumn show before it falls. They typically have large leaves that may be up to 6 inches long. Most



deciduous azaleas **prefer full sun to partial shade**. In shaded locations, deciduous azaleas flower less and are more vulnerable to fungal infections. Deciduous azaleas don't typically require special winter care, needing little to no water. Prune if they become leggy, immediately after blooming.

Evergreen varieties tend to grow to 6 feet or less with a mound-like shape. Their flowers may be white, purple, pink, red or orange, blooming in spring and sometimes in fall. The blooms come in a variety of forms, including strap-like, star-shaped or round petals. Their foliage is rarely longer than 2 inches, and stays year round. Evergreen azaleas **require partial shade** and protection from direct sun and wind. During the winter months, they require protection from wind and rain and additional watering if conditions are dry. Evergreen azaleas rarely require pruning, but if it is desired, should be done immediately after flowering.

Both varieties require moist, fertile, highly organic and well-drained soil that is slightly acidic. We recommend planting with peat moss and cotton burr compost. Native soils higher than pH 7.0 should be amended with organic matter. Fertilize both in late winter, as the plants break dormancy, and no later than July 1 to avoid winter damage. You can start by planting the root system 1-2" below ground level as well as mulch around the base of the plant in late fall. This will help keep these heat loving plants happy through our harsh winters. Also, they will freeze back in our climate each winter. Every spring, they are required to be pruned back to about 18" from the ground to ensure that the grow back full and lush each year. And be patient for them to show signs of new growth in the spring, they like to wait until it is "safe" to appear and begin growing for the season. The minimal extra care is well worth it as they are sure to be show-stoppers in your land-scape that hummingbirds and butterflies will love year after year.

BUTTERFLY BUSH

Black Night—(Buddleia davidii)



There is an abundant variety of shade tolerant and shade loving hydrangea. There are three main categories of them that we carry and they each have their own unique characteristics:

Oakleaf Hydrangeas: Foliage and flowers produce a spectacular show in the fall. Fall leaves range from wine-red to purple to a deep, rich burgundy. Blooms transform from white to purplish-pink. Prune after summer blooming. Little Leaf Hydrangeas: There is a wide variety of smaller leafed hydrangeas. The majority of them hardier than the Big Leaf Hydrangeas. They can be pruned anytime except spring/early summer.

Big Leaf Hydrangeas: Require extra care, including a protected location, moist, well-draining soil, shaded site and winter mulching. Blooms on new and old wood. For blue blooms, aluminum must be added in early spring before new growth begins. Prune after blooming or early spring once you begin to see the new growth. This variety tends to die back over winter.

BIG LEAF HYDRANGEA



Bloomstruck—(Hydrangea macrophylla)

One question we get a lot is "When do I cut back my ornamental grass? Fall or spring?" The answer is, that's totally up to you. You can cut it back in the fall if it's too unruly for you or you can choose to wait until spring. Just be sure to cut

it back! You'll want to cut it to about 6-8" off the ground. Grass that does not get cut will overcrowd itself and begin to thin out and die over time. Plus, it's not too aesthetically pleasing either as the previous year's growth begins to break off and leave a mess. With taller grasses, it is sometimes easier to tie together what you're cutting off for easier cleanup!

APPLE



Fuji

DAYLILIES

(Hermerocallis)

Hemerocallis, means "beauty for a day", and most daylily flowers open in the morning and die by nightfall. However, each flower stem (also called a scape) typically has at least a dozen flower buds, so the plant stays in bloom for several weeks. As the stems become spent and the foliage begins to tire, these can be removed throughout the season to keep your plants looking fresh. Daylilies come in numerous varieties, colors and sizes and thrive in **full sun**. Listed below are some popular rebloomers for our area. Check with the Garden Store for availability.

HOSTA

Hostas are the premier perennials for shade. They thrive in almost all degrees of shade. A few varieties can tolerate some morning sun. Beware of information touting about a sun-loving hosta. In the extreme conditions of our summers, they will burn. They thrive on **shade**, well-draining, loamy soil and ample water.

Primarily grown for their foliage, hostas do flower at different times throughout the summer, according to variety. Flower color varies from pure white to pale lavender to medium purple.

Listed below are a few of the varieties we carry. Check with the Garden Store for current varieties and availability.

BIG DADDY: Slug resistant, heavily cupped blue-green foliage with intense corrugation. **Mature size: 25" x 50"**

PATRIOT: Forest green leaves with pure white margins. Lavender flowers in August. **Mature size: 18" x 30"**

SUM AND SUBSTANCE: Slug resistant. Immense leathery leaves of chartreuse that become gold as summer approaches. Lavender flower blooming in summer. **Mature size: 31"** x 50"

PERENNIALS—GENERAL

The following is just a sample of some of the varieties of perennials we carry throughout the growing season. Most come in a variety of colors. Come to the Garden Store and browse our selections to see what's blooming!



Top Picks for Pollinators!



ACHILLEA (Yarrow): Prefers heat and dry soil. Summer bloomer. 24-36" tall and wide. Full sun.

AGASTACHE (Hyssop): Drought and heat tolerant. Blooms June until frost. Mulch in winter. 18-24" tall. Full sun.

ACLEA (Hollyhock): Biennial, good for the back of a border, slender and tall. Blooms mid to late summer. 24-36" tall. Full sun.

AQUILEGIA (Columbine): Graceful blooms spring to mid summer. Foliage turns red in the fall. 18" tall and wide. *Shade*.

ASCLEPIAS (Butterfly Weed): Extraordinary tall, glossy leaves with orange flowers mid to late summer. 36-54" tall. Full sun.

BAPTISIA (False Indigo): Sweet pea-like flowers bloom May to June. Interesting seed pods in the fall. Likes well-drained soil and is native to Kansas. 24-36" tall. Full sun.

CAMPANULA (**Beliflower**): Bell-like flowers beginning mid summer, works as an upright flower or tall groundcover. 12-18" tall. *Part Shade*.

DELPHINIUM (Larkspur): Tall spikes of colorful, fragrant flowers bloom early summer and rebloom sporadically through the growing season. 18" tall. Full sun.

ECHINACEA (Coneflower): Native flower, large center cone with radiating petals mid to late summer. Drought tolerant. Birds like the seeds in late fall. 12-18" tall. Full sun.

GALLARDIA: Brightly colored yellow to red flowers on low mounding plants. Loves hot, dry weather. Blooms mid through late summer. 15" tall. Full sun.

GYPSOPHILIA (**Baby's Breath**): Double white flowers blooming on airy stems mid through late summer. Long lasting blooms in the garden or in floral arrangements. 18-24" tall. Full sun.

LEUCANTHEUMUM (Shasta Daisy): Large, daisy-like flowers mid through late summer. Make great cut flowers. 36-42" tall. Full sun.

MONARDA (Bee Balm): Aromatic foliage and round flowers mid through late summer. Deadhead to encourage late blooming. Likes moist soil. 18-24" tall. Full sun.

NEPETA (Catmint): Violet flowers on spikes with aromatic gray/green foliage. Blooms all summer. Large and small varieties, 30-36" or 12-18" tall.

PENSTEMON: Tall, tubular flower spikes up from thick, glossy, green or purple foliage. 12-24" to flower tops, leaves 6-8" tall. Full sun to part shade.

PEROVSKIA (Russian Sage): Woody perennial with spires of lavender-blue flowers. Blooms late summer to fall. 24-48" tall. Full sun.

SALVIA (Meadow Sage): Intensely purple flower spikes bloom all summer long. Deadhead to encourage thicker rebloom. Likes hot, dry climate. 18-24" tall. Full sun.

SOLIDAGO (**Goldenrod**): Sprays of yellow flowers in late summer. Native plant. 24-36" tall. Full sun.

PERENNIALS—SHADE

ASTILBE: Arching branches of beautiful, soft, conical blooms in early spring off of soft, feather-like foliage. 18" tall. Shade.

BERGENIA: Cabbage-looking foliage turns a brilliant red in the fall. Red flowers bloom April to May. Works as a ground cover. 10-12" tall. Shade.

BRUNNERA (False Forget-Me-Not): Silvery foliage with iridescent blue flowers in spring. Likes consistently moist soil. Part shade to shade.

DECENTRA (Bleeding Heart): Heart-shaped blooms on light, airy foliage early in the spring. Many varieties available. 18-36" tall. Part shade.

DIGITALIS (Fox Glove): Tall spikes of white, cream, lavender or pink flowers. Biennial. 36" tall. Part shade.

EUPATORIUM (Joe Pye Weed): Mauve colored airy flowers late summer to fall. Likes moisture. Varieties with green or 'chocolate' colored foliage.36-54" tall. Part shade.

HELLEBOROUS (Lenten Rose): Beautiful, soft colored flowers bloom February to March on evergreen foliage. 12" tall. Part shade.

HEUCHERA (**Coral Bells**): Dainty, bell-shaped flowers peek out of their intriguingly colored foliage in late spring. Colors available in purple, black, orange and chartreuse, depending on variety. 18" tall. Shade.

LAMIUM: Soft looking variegated, heart-shaped leaves with pink, purple or white flowers from late spring to fall. 8-12" tall, 18-24" spread. Shade.

PULMONARIA (Lungwort): Beautiful green leaves with silver spots. Iridescent blue/ pink flowers in late spring. 8-12" tall, 18-24" spread. Shade.





PERENNIALS—SUN

ARTEMISIA (Wormwood): Brilliant silvery-green feather-like foliage. Drought tolerant once established. Beautiful accent plant. Varieties range from 8" to 36" tall. Full sun.

ASTER: Daisy-like flowers in fall. Pinch plants back until July to keep them in tact and encourage full blooming. 18" tall. Full sun.

COREOPSIS (**Tickseed**): Bright yellow, red or pink daisy like flowers that bloom spring til fall. 12-18" tall. Full sun.

DELOSPERMA (Ice Plant): Mats of succulent foliage that bloom almost neon bright tiny daisy like flowers. Likes it hot and dry. Easy to grow. 2-4" tall. Full sun.

DIANTHUS (Pinks): Fragrant tiny carnation-like flowers w/silver gray foliage. Must have well-drained soil. 8-12" tall. Full sun.

EUPHORBIA (Spurge): Outstanding foliage colors. Fast growing and compact. Can be evergreen. Use in the perennial bed or containers. 18-36" tall, depending on variety. Full sun.

GERANIUM (Hardy Geranium): Blue, pink, purple or white flowers bloom most of the summer on lush foliage that adds texture. 12-18" tall. Full sun to part shade.

HIBISCUS (Hardy Hibiscus): Huge, showy flowers that definitely attract attention. Blooms a good part of the season. 36-54" tall. Full sun.

KNIPHOFIA (Red Hot Poker): Bright red to orange flower spikes with yucca like foliage. Prefers a hot and dry climate.

LIATRIS (Gayfeather): Native to Kansas. Spikes of soft, fuzzy purple flowers mid summer. Sometimes called Blazing Star. 12-18" tall. Full sun.

PAEONIA (Peony): Large, fragrant flowers usually blooming in May. Wide range of varieties and colors and heights. Taller plants may need supports. Usually 36-48" tall. Full sun.



PAPAVER (Poppy): Brilliantly colored cupped flowers in the spring. Plant goes dormant for the year after flowering. 30" tall. Full sun.

PHLOX (Tall Garden Phlox): Explosion of fragrant flowers atop a tall, slender stem with dark green spiked foliage. 24-48" tall depending on variety. Full sun.

SCABIOSA (Pin Cushion Flower): Delicate blue or pink cushion flowers above neat mounds of foliage. Blooms all summer. 18" tall. Full sun.

SEMPERVIVUM (Hen and Chicks): Evergreen succulents with fleshy rosette leaves. Likes hot, dry conditions. 2-3" tall. Full sun.

STACHYS (Lamb's Ear): Silver, velvety leaves that can be used as a contrast plat or ground-cover. Blooms either pink or white early summer. 6" to 3' tall depending on variety. Full sun

TRADESCANTIA (**Spiderwort**): 'Sweet Kate' has chartreuse foliage with blue flowers; 'Concord Grape' has dark green foliage with purple flowers. Blooms in the summer, but more profusely in cooler temperature. Prefers a moist site.12-18" tall. Full sun to part shade.

VERONICA (**Speedwell):** Spikes of blue, pink, purple or white flowers through the summer on lush, green foliage. 18-20" tall. Full sun to part shade.



CLEMATIS



CLEMATIS PRICING: 1 gal...\$25 2 gal...\$40

Clematis, sometimes referred to as "queen of the climers" make a bright, beautiful, soft touch to any landscape. They can be trained to grow up just about anywhere, but love trellises. The following are the three different types of clematis available, categorized by their bloom time, but each come in a wide variety of colors. Check with the Garden Store to see what's available.

GROUP 1: Minimal Pruning

Produces flowers on previous season's growth. Pruning for this group consists of removing all dead and weak stems after flowering. Tie all the stems into position immediately after pruning for strength. A well-established plant should not require any pruning. The group consists of the evergreen species alpine, macropetala and montana.

GROUP 2: Moderate Pruning

This includes the early, large flowering varieties such as the double, semi-double and midseason clematis. They produce flowers on old or previous season's stems. Pruning this group should be done in April or early May. Remove all dead and weak stems, then simply trim the remaining stems enough to keep it under control. All remaining stems need to be ties to gives space for new growth.

GROUP 3: Hard Pruning

This group bears their flowers on new growth each year and, in most cases, each stem produces several flowers. The old or previous season's growth dies back naturally each winter. Therefore, all old growth must be removed to allow for new growth. Prune this group in late April or early May, depending on the weather. Pruning consist of removing all old top growth down to about 12 -18" above ground level.


Newly Planted Clematis


Regardless of flowering habits, all clematis should be pruned hard, to 12-18" from the ground the first spring after planting. This helps encourage a sturdier, more heavily branched base, making the vine more durable. It is also a good idea to mulch around the base of your clematis in the fall, removing the mulch when pruning in April or May.

OTHER VINES

CLIMBING HONEYSUCKLE: Tall climbers with tubular flowers. Great for humming-birds and highly fragrant. Blooms through summer. Matures to 10-20' tall, wide. Full sun. **TRUMPET VINE:** Bright red-orange 4" flowers on rapidly growing fines. Requires support or trellis. Matures to 10-40' tall, wide. Full sun.





- Provides insulation layer
- Conserves soil moisture
- Improves soil's physical structure and fertility
- Prevents erosion
- Reduces root competition



Best Planting Practices

Container Plants: Dig the hole about 6-8 inches wider, and as deep as the root ball. Remove your plant from the container and cut vertically along the root ball. This will help the roots realize they are out of the container and can begin spreading out.

Place your plant in the hole, be sure the root ball is even with or slightly above ground level. Planting too deep can cause the roots to drown. See that you have the plant facing the direction you want. Now you can begin to back fill with ½ soil amendment* and ½ soil from the hole. You want to water as you're back filling, "stirring" the soil mix and water as you go. This will help prevent any air pockets and help secure your plant in place by settling the soil. Apply root stimulator.

Ball & Burlap Trees: Dig the hole 2 times wider than the diameter of the root ball with sloping sides to allow for proper root growth. Dig deep enough so the trunk flare sits slightly above ground level with most of the roots to be buried 1-2 inches beneath the soil. It's always better to plant slightly too high than too deep. See that you have your tree facing the direction you want. Now you can begin to back fill with ½ soil amendment* and ½ soil from the hole. Water as you are back filling, "stirring" the soil mix and water as you go. This will help prevent any air pockets and help secure your tree in place by settling the soil. Apply root stimulator.

Mulch & Stake: You will want to mulch around your trees, 2 to 3 inches deep, leaving 1 to 2 inches clearance between the trunk and the mulch, in a 3 foot radius around the tree. This will protect it from weeds and equipment. Stake your tree to stabilize it and let the tender roots really dig and grow in to the ground.

*We recommend Back to Earth Cotton Burr Compost

Caring for your new plants

After initial watering, check your plants for water every day to every other day for the first few weeks, watering when necessary. A slow, deep soak to the soil is best.

Not enough water is harmful to your plant, but too much can do damage as well. The best way to judge is by feel. You want the soil to feel damp, but not soggy, 2 inches below soil level. Using a root stimulator every 2 to 3 weeks during the first two growing seasons is highly recommended as well.

The Blueville Story

Blueville Nursery was established in 1933 by Marlin and Gladys Scott on Blueline Road in Manhattan, Kansas. They operated it until 1962 when Darrell and Dorothy Westervelt purchased the nursery. Blueville Nursery moved to its current location in 1969 which was, at that time, their growing field established in 1963. A small Garden Store was then started opening in the spring of 1970.

The nursery was incorporated in 1972 so that other employees could acquire part of the company's ownership. Blueville currently has 18 stockholders including Keith Westervelt. Keith was elected President and CEO in December 1998 and has retained a little over 50% ownership of the corporation.

The Nursery contains about 45 acres of which about 30 are devoted to growing trees, evergreens, shrubs, and sod. Growing is done primarily for our landscaping and retail sales with surplus plants being marketed wholesale. The nursery also buys plants to re-wholesale to other nurseries and landscapers.

A new operations shop with landscape office was built in 1991 and a new Garden Store was built in 1992. Recent improvements include a new 125' x 80' warehouse which includes an enclosed and climate controlled pesticide storage and handling area. Also a 40' x 80' machinery storage/warehouse, a 50' x 95' warehouse, and many bulk landscape material bins.

The Blueville staff consists of long-time, year-round staff and many part -time and temporary employees. Blueville promotes a family-like atmosphere creating many long-standing employees. Part-time employees, mostly KSU students, provide many of these hours. During the busy spring and fall seasons there will be over 100 employees on payroll. Younger employees are constantly being recruited to maintain vigor and add new ideas.

Blueville considers its retail trade territory to be about a 100-mile radius from Manhattan with most landscape work done in Manhattan, Junction City, Clay Center, and Wamego.

For management and record keeping the business is divided into 6 areas: Garden Store, Irrigation, Landscape, Maintenance, Nursery (growing), and Administration. Since purchasing the nursery in 1962 Blueville Nursery has never had an unprofitable year. Blueville Nursery is the largest nursery in Kansas outside of the large metro areas (Wichita and Kansas City). Our company continues to improve our facilities and equipment and add new services and merchandise.
