# Striated Grasswren Amytornis striatus Species No.: 513 Band size: 03 AY



#### Status:

Four subspecies were recognised until 2016 when three were elevated to species status. The species is now recognised as occupying only the central & lower Murray-Darling Basin of NSW, Vic & SA. See separate sheets for Pilbara, Rusty and Sandhill Grasswrens.

## Ageing:

Juveniles are similar to adults but fluffier;

Immatures are very similar to adults, but retain juvenile primaries, secondaries and tail, but these are only separable from adults if synchronous growth-bars can be detected;

Breed throughout Spring and post-breeding season moult of adults occurs from November on; Immatures moult to full adult plumage at about 12 months old coinciding with the post-breeding season moult of adults:

So birds identified as adults in Autumn, Winter and Spring will be at least (2+); Immatures will be either (1) or (2-).

### Sexing:

Sexes not dimorphic on measurements;

Adult birds can be separated by the colour of the flanks:

- Male flanks vary from cream or buff to yellow-brown;
- Female flanks rufous patch on anterior flanks.

Incubation is probably by female only.
